Update on the Youth Club a year on

This time last year the County Council voted to withdraw funding from all the Youth Clubs in Dorset so it is perhaps a good time to recap on the events and progress we have made over the last 12 months. We have achieved a lot, but still have a way to go to have a Youth club for all the young people of Corfe Mullen. We would also like to thank all the residents of Corfe Mullen for their support.

First, in March, the Parish Council put in a very sound bid to take over the Youth Club Building and support the Youth Club financially but the Cabinet of the County Council decided to give the building to Lockyers School who plan to extend Music provision and provide Breakfast and Afterschool clubs.

After some discussion it was agreed that the building was large enough to be shared equally if building work was done to divide the building in half. The County Council agreed to do the necessary building work as a priority. We hope this work will be done during the summer holidays 2017.

In the meantime, we are glad to say that the nursery, Bright Sparks, has been able to continue operating until July 2017.

In July we registered the Charity, the Corfe Mullen Youth Trust, with 4 local Trustees. We secured very generous funding from the Parish Council, through the Council Tax precept. The Parish Council had had the foresight to work towards all this from January 2016. Once we had formed a Charity we were also able to start to apply for grants.

By October the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme was up and running again, with the aid of volunteers and the assistance of Corfe Coffee who rented their premises to us at a very reasonable rent. By November we had two part time staff, we had advertised and re-engaged two Youth Workers known to many of us, Nigel Christopher and Jo Bissell. They ran Youth Café evenings in Corfe Coffee and did some Outreach work.

To date, from the beginning of January, we now employ 4 part time staff members, Jacky Sherwood has joined us as a Finance/Admin Officer and Matt Crabb, a newcomer to Corfe Mullen, but not to Youth Work, has

joined the team and is looking forward to meeting all our young people

There is not a lot for young people to do in the evenings in Corfe Mullen and they need positive activities, especially at this time of year. The Police have noticed a marked increase in groups of youngsters hanging around the village in the evenings, and a minority of them are causing trouble for the residents. We need to redirect their energy.

We are still negotiating with the County Council and Lockyers school to be able to rent the Youth Centre during the evenings up until the start of the building work in the summer. Once we can use a larger building then the Youth Club of old, with a programme of varied activities, can be restored, which is what we are all waiting for! We are all hoping to see the lights go back on in the Youth Centre building in the evenings.

Budget and precept 2017-18

The Parish Council set its budget and precept (Parish Council part of the council tax bill) when it met on 10th January 2017.

The precept has been set at £294475 which is a modest increase of 2.18% and represents a 1.25% increase on the average Band D household's council tax bill.

The Parish Council increased the precept last year in order to offer funding to the Youth Centre, but has managed to spend carefully and utilise some of its reserves to keep its share of the council tax bill down this year..

The replacement skate park, although delayed, is still planned for 2017, and the Parish Council will also be contributing to the much-needed replacement roof at the Village Hall.

The Parish Council is also funding £1000 towards improvements to the public footpath between Brook Lane and Newtown Lane to make it safer and easier to walk along for pedestrians.

A provisional sum of £10000 has been included in the budget in anticipation of further cuts at County Council level.

Safer Neighbourhood Team Report

We are pleased to report that we have seen a decrease in burglaries and attempted burglaries in the Corfe Mullen area over the last quarter. However we still ask residents to remain vigilant during the winter months as thieves often target sheds and garages. Please secure your sheds with heavy duty padlocks and install security lighting where possible. Chain expensive items together or to a strong anchor point. For garages it is a good idea to install sliding bolts to the bottom corners of your garage door and secure them with padlocks. This prevents the door from being forced open.

We would like to encourage all residents to view the selection of crime prevention products that the local Home Watch team has to offer. Corfe Mullen NPT has been running a successful "Speed Watch" team for the past two years. You may have seen them around the village. The role of the Community Speed Watch Team is to monitor the speed of traffic passing through the village on key roads at key times.

The team is equipped with a basic radar device and they record the details of speeding vehicles. The details they collect are passed onto the Corfe Mullen NPT. A letter of advice is then sent to the registered keeper's address of the vehicle spotted. If the same vehicle is then spotted a second time a more direct letter is sent. The third time the same vehicle is spotted the details are then passed onto our "No excuse" road policing team who then visit the registered address. I am pleased to say that in the two years the team have been active we haven't had to pass any details onto our "No excuse" team.

Furthermore the percentage of speeding vehicles the "Speed Watch" team spot has reduced over the two years which would indicate the number of vehicles speeding through the village has decreased. To carry on this good work we are looking for new volunteers to join the Speed Watch team. If this is something you may be interested in please contact Corfe Mullen NPT on 101 to get further information.

STOP PRESS A number of vehicles have been damaged in the Corfe Mullen area over that last couple of weeks. As a result of residents prompt reporting, officers along with a dog unit and the Police helicopter were dispatched and as a result three males were apprehended. They are currently assisting Police with their enquiries.

It is free to join the library and membership gives you access to a fantastic collection of books, eBooks, eMagazines and information.

We run weekly free computer classes, a Knit and Natter Group and Carer's Group. For children, we have a weekly Rhyme Time with the Children's Centre, Saturday craft activities and fun children's reading group, Chatterbooks.

You can borrow up to 20 books and use your library card in all Dorset libraries, including Poole libraries.

Our library has free Wi-Fi, computer access and free printing for homework.

We also provide a free Home Library Service to bring books and audiobooks to anyone who can't visit the library.

East Dorset Citizens Advice hold a drop-in session on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month 10am-12pm.

We share our building with Corfe Mullen Children's Centre, who run weekly activities for children and support for families. Just a few of the activities they run are a Monday Rhyme Time 10:30-11:30am, a Childminders' Group and a Wednesday play group, Exploring Together 10:00-11:30am.

The library is on the Wareham Road by the large Co-op store, with free parking.
