Village Hall/Towers Way Amenity Land

The transfer of ownership of this land to the Parish Council completed on 1st May and already there is an improvement to the amenity area with an increased frequency of grass-cutting.

The Parish Council is keen to enhance this area, initially by tidying up overgrown areas, so if you have any ideas of improvements you would like to see, please do get in touch.

Skate Park

Due to staff sickness, there has been a delay in the installation of three benches around the new skate park, so please bear with us.

Sadly we recently experienced some extensive graffiti damage to the skate park which is costing £650 plus VAT to remove. The police are investigating.

Henbury Play Area

The Council has put out to tender the refurbishment of this play area following the renewal of the Parish Council's licence on this Dorset Council-owned land.

Once a design has been approved, it is hoped that the work will be undertaken in autumn/early winter.

Village Hall improvements

We are delighted to announce that our grant application to the Big Lottery Fund to install air conditioning in the village hall was successful, with 100% of the costs being funded. The air conditioning has been installed meaning that aerobics ,dancing etc. can continue safely even on the hottest days.



Highways

The measures to prevent illegal and inconsiderate parking on the verge outside BH Live and the Towers Way Coop are taking place in June and July. Can we remind all residents not to park on verges, to park considerately, and to remember that it is safe and legal to park along roads such as the Wareham Road without having a significant effect on traffic flow. Let's keep the village tidy and safe!

The Parish Council is closely monitoring the effectiveness of Dorset Highways weed spraying of pavements and gutters this year. Spraying is being undertaken in June so if you are unhappy with how your road has been cleared of weeds, please do get in touch, preferably with photos and the date these were taken.

Staff change

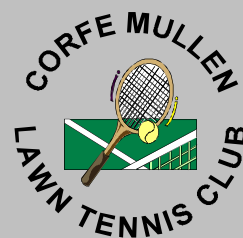

Your local Police Safer Neighbourhood Team Report
from Police Community Support Officer Neal Rooke



Recently we have seen a rise in anti-social behaviour in Corfe Mullen. This is mainly occurring around the Towers Way, Corfe Mullen Recreation Ground and Victoria Close Play Park. The Neighbourhood Policing team are working closely with other agencies to reduce disrupt and deter this type of behaviour. That said, we ask residents to continue to report any anti-social behaviour you may witness.

I would like to take this opportunity to raise awareness of a national issue. This issue is commonly known as 'County Lines'. This is where drug gangs from big cities expand their operations to smaller towns, driving out local dealers and exploiting children and vulnerable people to sell drugs. These dealers will use vulnerable people's houses as a base of operation. This is commonly known as 'cuckooing'. A number of gang members will move into the address and take over often without the home owner's permission. This is not usually reported to police through fear of repercussions. From this address the gang will receive large quantities of drugs from the fellow gang members in the cities and distribute these in the smaller towns.

Signs to look out for if you suspect your neighbour may have been cuckooed.

- People calling at a local address - often at unsociable hours
- Suspicious vehicles or people at an address
- A neighbour that has not been seen for a while
