## **Walk 3** The Heritage Walk

Length:

4½ miles approx.

**Duration:** 3½ hours approx. Terrain:

Tarmac roads and lanes, bare earth

footpaths, grass and gravel paths and

bridleways.

Start Point: Car Park at Village Hall

## Start...

- Walk through library gardens to the Wareham
- Turn right, passing the Family Church and right again into Central Avenue.
- Stay on the right and look for footpath on right at bend in the road. Fairly steep footpath down to Orchard Lane.
- Cross straight over into Haywards Lane and walk to
- Turn left along Broadmoor Road until bend.
- Cross over and take bridleway to Knoll Farm Christian Mission Church.
- Walk through Knoll Farm farmyard; pick up grassy footpath across gravel and in between two white buildings to your left.
- Walk through gate and on to Knoll Lane.
- Turn right and walk down lane passing old railway level crossing, one gate still in place, down to the
- Turn right to visit St. Hubert's Church and old cross in churchyard.
- Retrace your steps, cross Knoll Lane and pick up pavement along Mill Street. Across the road you can see the Court House, the Coventry Arms and Corfe Mullen mill.
- Opposite the Coventry Arms turn into Brickyard Lane.
