Walk 4 The Heath and Valley Walk

Length: 5½ miles approx. **Duration:** 4 hours approx.

> Tarmac roads and lanes, dirt footpaths and gravel lanes.

Start Point: Car Park at Village Hall

Start...

- ▶ Walk through library gardens to the Wareham
- ▶ Turn right, passing the Family Church and right again into Central Avenue.
- ▶ Walk up left hand side of Central Avenue and look for footpath on left, before bend.
- ▶ Walk length of narrow steep footpath down to Brook Lane.
- ► Cross straight over in to Brook Lane, walk down lane and look for footpath on left, at side of house - the one after black/white Tudor style.
- ▶ Stay on footpath and come out at Chapel Close.
- ▶ Walk ahead, turn right and walk down Chapel
- ► Turn left along Waterloo Road until you see wide gravel track on the right.
- ▶ Follow this track, past a saw mill and several houses, until it comes out on Rushall Lane.
- ▶ Turn left and walk along lane, past Stony Down Plantation until you come to a wide dirt lane on the left. You have a clear view of reconstruction at the landfill site and of Beacon Hill.
- ▶ Walk length of lane till it reaches the Old Wareham Road. Holme Bush Inn on your right.
- ▶ Turn left, cross road and walk up to the junction at Naked Cross.
